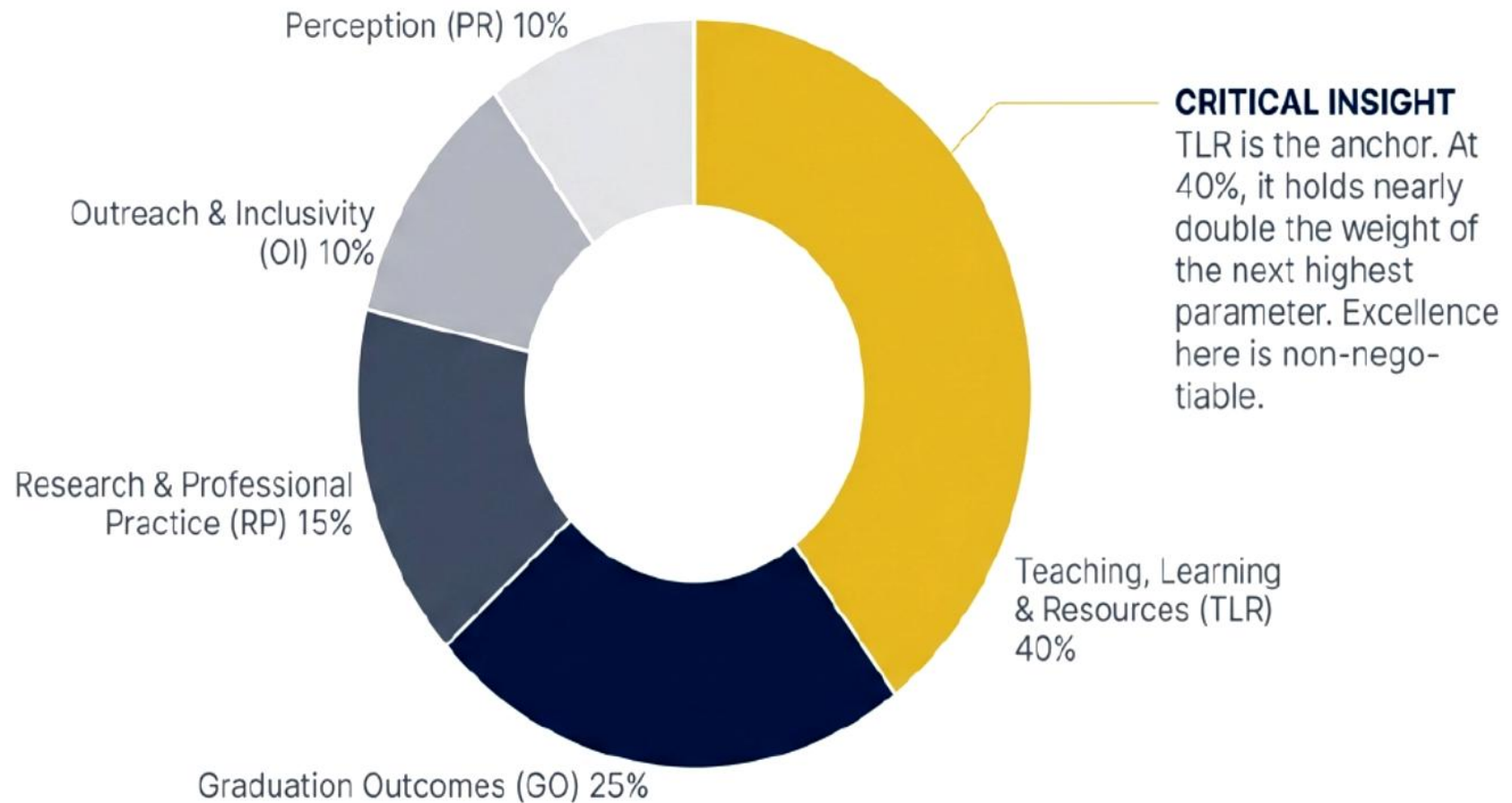

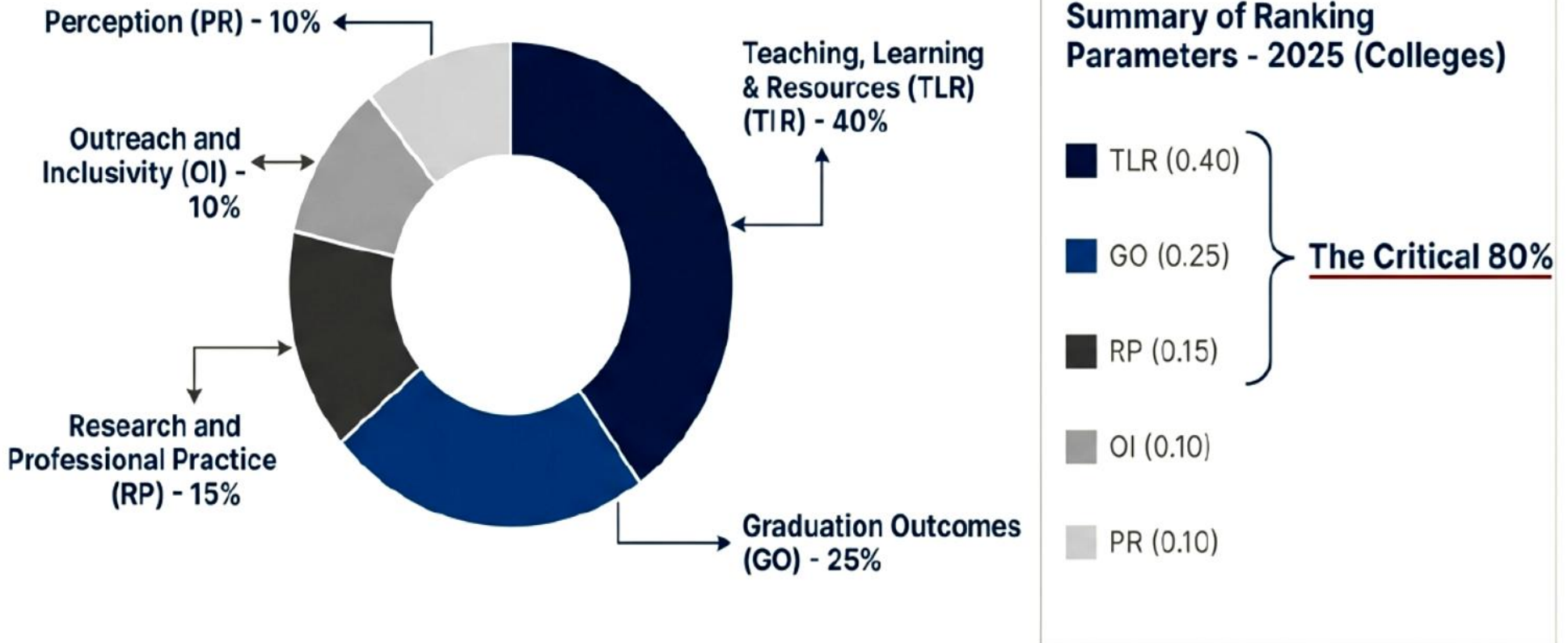

Student Strength (SS) - 20 Marks

Faculty-Student Ratio (FSR) - 30 Marks

The Golden Standard is 1:20. Emphasis is on permanent faculty. Contract faculty count only if they taught both semesters of 2023-24.

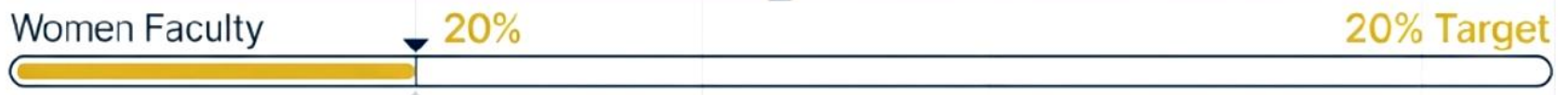

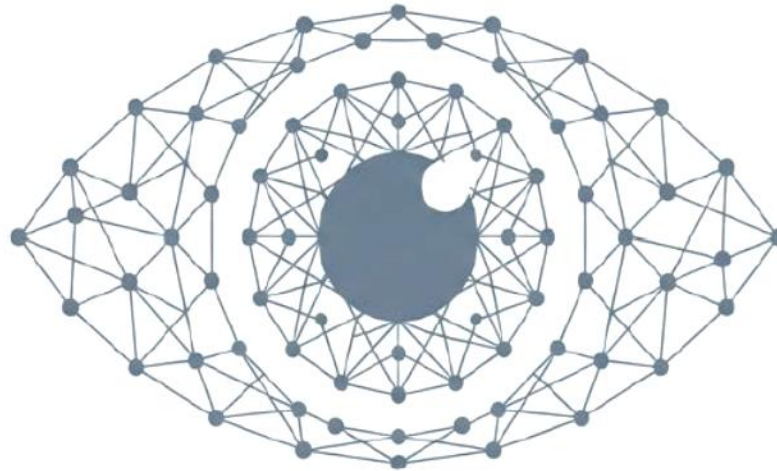

1 Faculty Definitions

-  **Regular Appointment:** Means faculty on a full-time basis.
-  **Contract/Ad-hoc:** Considered ONLY if the faculty has taught in BOTH semesters of the academic year 2023-24.
-  **Qualifications:** PhD and Master's degrees are counted. Bachelor's degrees are not counted.

2 Financial Exclusions

-  **Capital Expenditure (BC):** Excludes construction of new buildings.
-  **Operational Expenditure (BO):** Excludes maintenance of hostels and allied services.

3 Timeframes

-  **Rule of Three:** Financial and Outcome data usually requires averages over the previous three years.

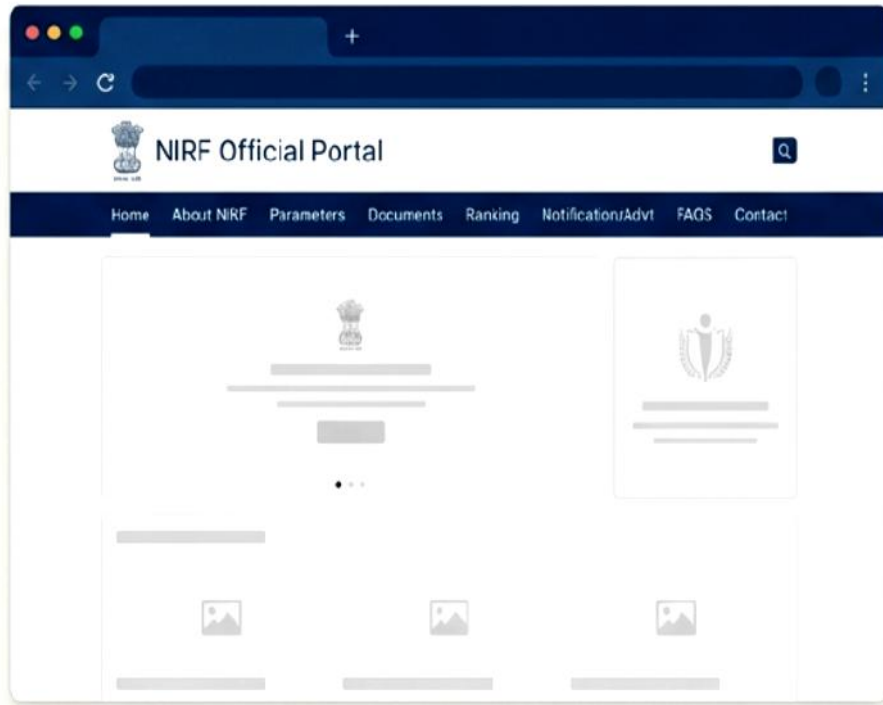

How India Ranks Its Colleges: A Breakdown of the NIRF 2025 Framework

National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF): A methodology launched by the Ministry of Education, Government of India, to rank higher education institutions across the country.

Teaching, Learning & Resources (TLR)

This is the most heavily weighted parameter, focusing on the core educational infrastructure and learning environment.



Student Strength (SS):

Evaluates the total sanctioned student intake versus the actual number of enrolled students in all UG and PG programs.



Faculty-Student Ratio (FSR):

A ratio of 1:20 (faculty to students) is the target to achieve maximum marks, with an emphasis on permanent faculty.



Faculty Qualifications & Experience (FQE):

Measures the percentage of faculty with a Ph.D. and rewards a balanced distribution of faculty experience (<8, 8-15, and >15 years).



Financial Resources & Utilisation (FRU):

Assesses the average annual capital and operational expenditure per student over the previous three years.

Median Salary (GMS):

Tracks the median salary of graduates from the institution over the previous three years.

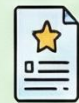

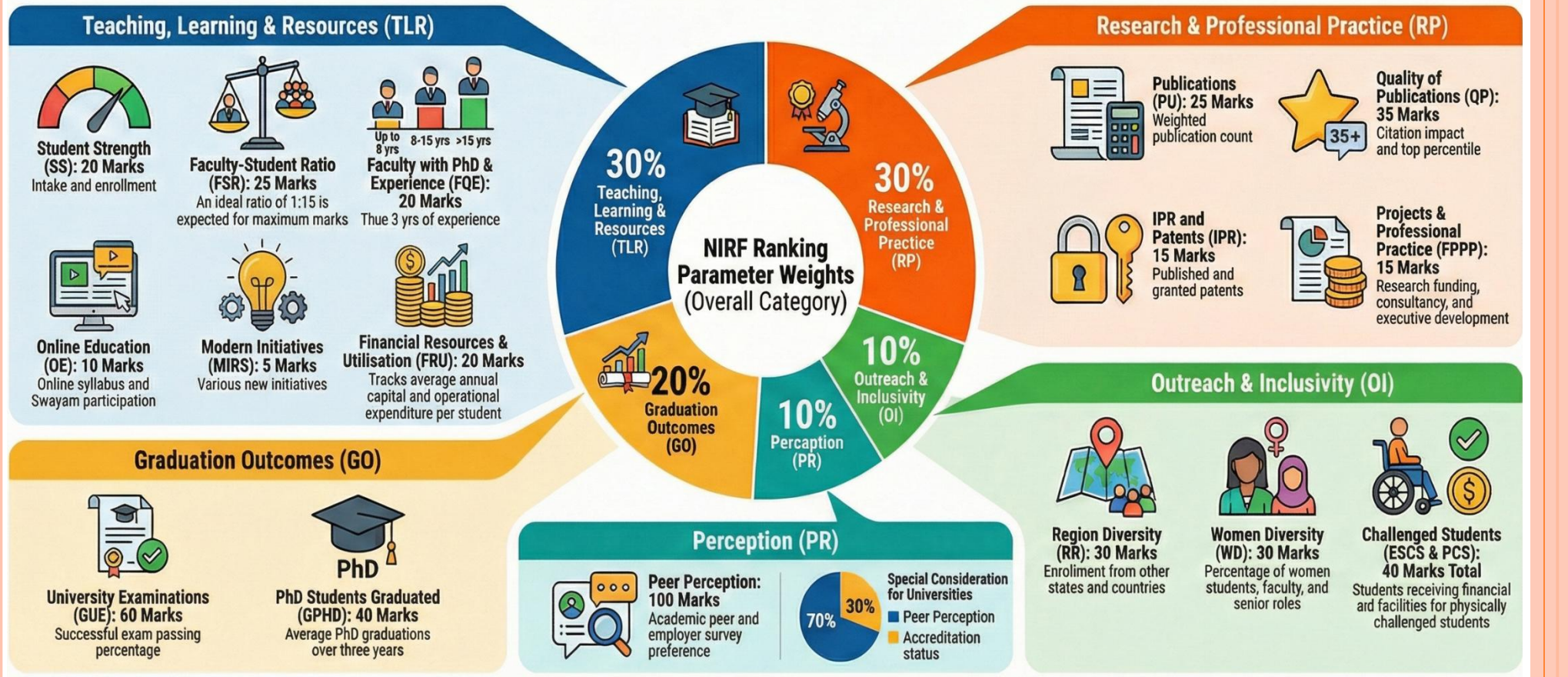

nirf Decoding the NIRF 2025 Rankings: A Guide to the Methodology

The National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) uses a composite score out of 100 from five weighted parameters to evaluate Indian higher education institutions. This guide breaks down the methodology for the "Overall" category.



Who Can Be Ranked? Key Eligibility Criteria

- Overall vs. Discipline-Specific Ranking**
 - Overall Rank:** >1000 UG/PG students
 - Discipline-Specific Rank:** <1000 students (Focused)
- Minimum Graduation History Required:** At least 3 batches from full-time programs
- Separate Registration for University Departments:** University departments must for discipline-specific ranks.
- Physical Campus is Mandatory:** Open and affiliating universities are generally excluded unless they have a campus.
